## *Hello and Welcome*

Welcome to the 2021 Devon Tour and this the annual brochure with the usual mass of information that helps you to survive the trip to Devon, assists you in not getting your credit card purloined by an exotic dancer, how to avoid getting a black eye on a Sunday night and gives you guidance as to which is the best bit of pavement in Exeter to fall asleep on.

This year as we embark on Devon Tour number 56, we once again start the tour at Kilmington with a visit to our long standing friends at Kilmington, so make an early start and get to the Old Inn for the first pre-prandial on tour. Heathcoat again entertain us on Monday (and hopefully brother Jenkins can once again avoid incident en route). Tuesday is new fixture for the Old Haberdashers as we visit Whimple Cricket Club for the first time, who come highly recommended from our friend Paul at the Jack and the Green. Exeter and their lovely newish, shiny pavilion remain our Wednesday fixture. On Thursday we make a rare venture West of Exeter, journeying to Paignton who kindly stepped in at short notice after Seaton pulled out. Finally, it's another early start again at Sidmouth as there's a Battle of Britain fly past later in the day, which at least means we can get an early start for the drive back for Saturday's league matches and hopefully match the 1<sup>st</sup> XI's record run chase of 2019.

We return to the Gipsy Hill Hotel, where we stayed for three years between 2015 and 2017. Situated just East of Exeter it is well placed for both the majority of our fixtures and the odd venture into the big smoke.

The evening's fines sessions have moved into the modern area with the club's new card reader – forgetting change no longer an excuse! For the tour virgins you need to learn the drill pretty quickly, fines for ducks, being hit for six, not getting in to double figures, losing the toss, being late on tour, failing to make breakfast, wides, no balls and loads more that is all horribly unfair, but there again life's tough especially in Devon!

2019 saw us end up with a tour record of two wins, one loss and three draws in glorious weather, so here's hoping the fine weather holds until the end of August and that we complete all six games with positive results.

With much of tour the same as always, it would be remiss not to mention the most significant difference this year which is of course the absence of our dear friend Simon, particularly as we start the tour at Kilmington, a fixture synonymous with Gelbs which he would captain and almost always expertly engineer a close finish. Newps has kindly penned a piece on the next page about Simon's time in Devon which I'm sure will do far greater justice to him than anything I could say. We've organised a few additions to Kilmington game to commemorate Simon, and will compete annually with Kilmington for the Simon Gelber Memorial Trophy.

I know how much more work organising tour has been this year, largely due to the unseen work that Simon did in previous tours. I thought I had a fairly easy gig but that was only due to his efforts behind the scene. He never asked for any praise or recognition for all he did to keep the OH wheel turning, and it's only in his absence that we can truly appreciate how much time and effort he put into our club. It's hard to envisage what tour will be like without Gelbs, but I know that he would have wanted us to play cricket (hopefully well in parts), drink plenty of beers, and above all, have a good time with our friends. I'll leave you with Gelbs' closing sentence from the 2019 tour brochure intro:

"It only goes for us to say enjoy the brochure, enjoy tour – that is what they are there for and hopefully everyone involved will have fun and of course not over imbibe in alcoholic beverages (well just a thought!)."

## Simon Gelber

"I'll see you in Devon on tour, Newps"

In the (normally) annual OH "must have" publication that is the tour brochure it only seems right to record the passing of Simon Gelber from a tour perspective. The legend that was W.R. (Nobbly) Tanner divided OHCC tours into two eras, the Original Era (1960-1972) and the Modern Era (1978-present).

In the Modern Era, in 2021, we will have an unprecedented (yes, that word again!) tour to Devon. It will be a first tour without another OHCC legend, Simon Gelber. I have toured most years since 1985 and in those early years, the standard was high (generally too high for me), all games were timed and everyone wanted to play as many matches as they could. It was a full on week of late nights and good cricket. As Simon would say the next morning to those of a fragile disposition, who were having second thoughts about playing that day: "You're here to play cricket!"



In those early touring years you tried not to incur the Gelber Glare after a dropped catch off his bowling as Simon was very committed to ensuring we could hold our heads high as a touring side by keeping our standards of cricket and respect to our opponents beyond criticism. It paid off occasionally as we often faced Devon county players in the 80s and 90s and gave a good account of ourselves with some well-earned victories.

Indeed, this was Simon's summer holiday, winter was for the overseas trips to exotic shores, the summer holiday was South Devon tour. He played the majority of matches until in recent years age caught up with him and rest days crept in or occasionally a trip back for a county 50s or 60s match might curtail the week by a couple of days. Over the years, Simon's constant presence ensured the fixture list evolved and to some, more importantly, the pub and culinary list evolved alongside. He had his favourite fixtures and favourite pubs, those that didn't quite make the grade were quietly sidelined in favour of a new venue. Equally one of his favourite sayings about Tour was "If it ain't broke, don't fix it!"

As in league cricket, he always enjoyed the challenge against the better players and was always keen to discuss the match in the bar after the game especially that one ball that had caused the centurion a problem or as a batsman when he picked the 'other one'. There are too many memories to recount here but Gelbs provided that link to the first tours of the Modern Era with many stories that were recounted every year, giving a history to the younger generations of OH cricketers that would otherwise be lost.

Whilst in Devon, Gelbs would also keep in touch with past OHCC members in the area and would head off to find a mobile phone signal to ring Peter Lidington, or drop round for a cup of tea with John Ridgley in Sidmouth. Putting the world to rights with Doug at Sidmouth was also an annual ritual. So the days of Simon picking up a car-less tourist from Hendon Central, heading off to the Old Inn a bit early to have a pint pre-Kilminster with John Lavender or chatting with Paul pre-dinner at the Jack in the Green about how business has been are no more.

The title? Was always Simon's parting shot from a nondescript Herts League ground as I headed home to a county south of the Thames after umpiring or playing, sometime in late July or early August. Well now Gelbs it's a case of "I'll remember you in Devon" at all the grounds you played on for so many years with so much enjoyment.

The traditional Memorial Gin and Tonic on the first evening will now be in memory of an extra OH tourist added to Nobbly and Bakes.

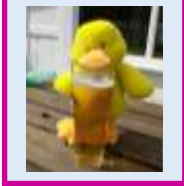

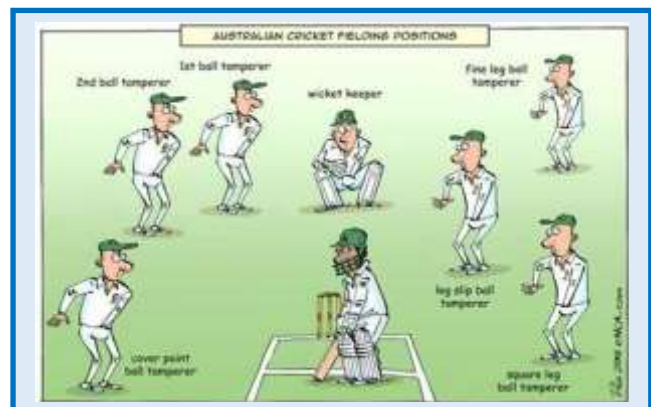
### Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup>

*Best day to go: Wednesday*

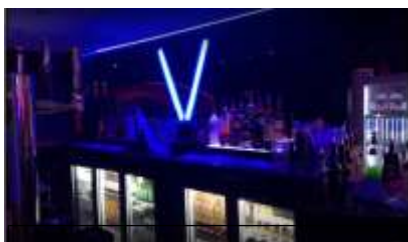

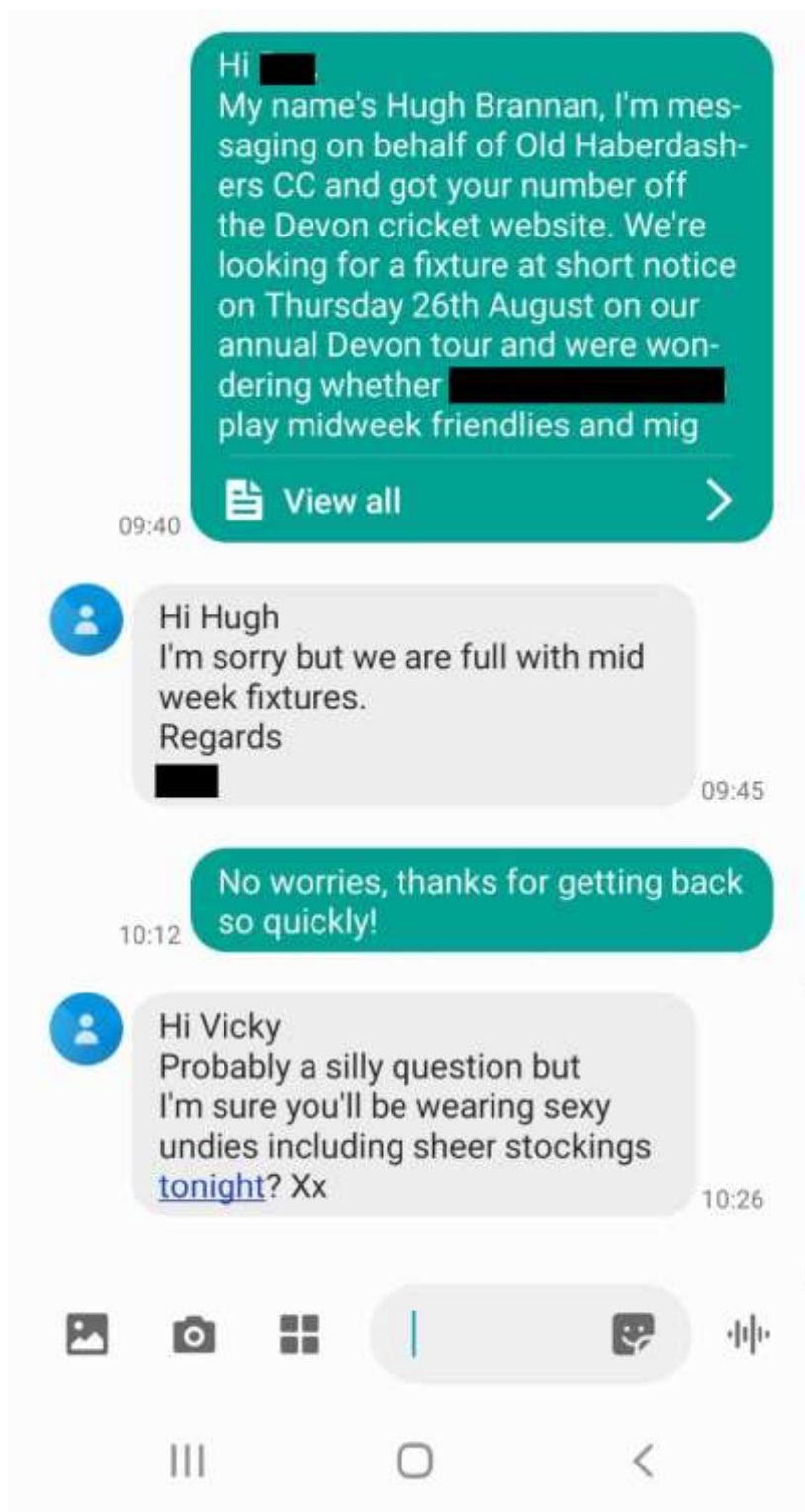
